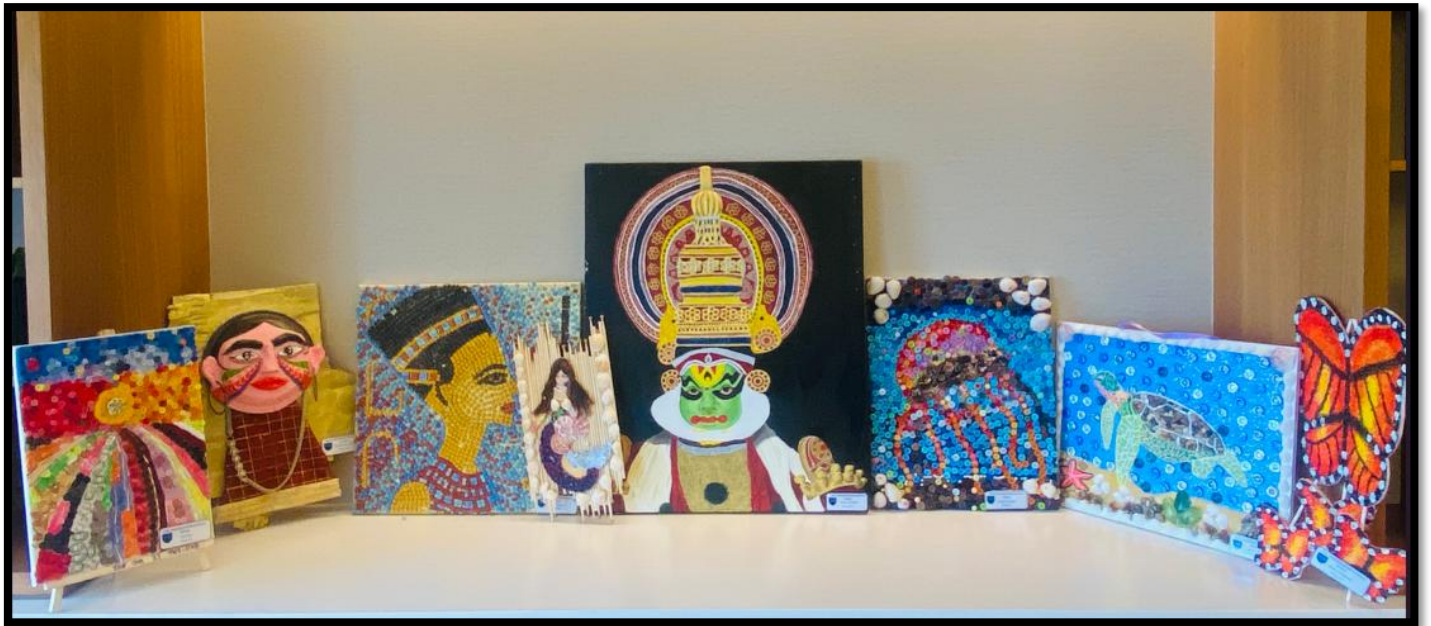
At TWS, we believe that sustainability is not just an idea, but a way of life. Through initiatives like these, we nurture students to become the changemakers of tomorrow.
